OPINIONS

The order of the U.S. District Court, in action 80-4526 SAW, filed on April 27, 1981, stated:

Plaintiff seeks a court order directing the National Transportation Safety Board to reopen its investigation of the Pacific Southwest Airlines air crash in San Diego on September 25, 1978.

Plaintiff alleges two bases for this court's jurisdiction of the matter: 28 U.S.C. 1361, and section 1007 of the Federal Aviation Act, codified as 49 U.S.C. 1487. Neither of these code provisions affords this court jurisdiction. Exclusive jurisdiction for review of National Transportation Safety Board orders rests in the U.S. Courts of Appeals. See 49 U.S.C. 1903(d).

Accordingly,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this matter is dismissed.
