Ref: Former federal agent putting you and other members of the Senate and House judiciary committees on notice of corrupt activities linked to, among other blowback consequences, the hijackings of four airliners on 9/11, and the corrupt acts by federal judges that enabled these federal offenses to continue.

To Senator Hatch:

The intent of this letter is to make a record showing that you have been sent a letter by a former federal agent (a) seeking to report documented corrupt activities that I and a group of other government agents had tried to report, and (b) the criminal cover-ups and retaliation by federal judges who blocked the reports. These activities are related to a long series of national tragedies. Attached to this letter is a copy of a January 24, 2005, letter sent to each of the Justices of the U.S. Supreme Court.

The history of cover-ups by many members of the House and Senate over the years doesn't suggest anything but further cover-up for the matters referred to in this letter. The *direct responsibility* of members of the House and Senate judiciary committees, to whom this letter is addressed, is the documented corruption by a large number of federal judges. The other issues also invoke responsibility.

Some of the recipients of this letter are already implicated through prior cover-ups that enabled to occur some of the nation's greatest tragedies.

Several points must be recognized: (1) The misconduct by federal judges is well documented; (2) the corruption and relation to airline disasters are well documented; (3) the underlying criminal activities in other areas would be supported by testimony that I and several other former government agents are willing to provide; and (4) the consequences, if my allegations are true, does not permit a cover-up.

You, as a member of Congress and the judiciary committee, as well as under the federal crime reporting statute 18 USC § 4,¹ have a responsibility to act in such a manner that these charges are fully investigated.

¹ Title 18 U.S.C. § 4. Misprision of felony. Whoever, having knowledge of the actual commission of a felony cognizable by a court of the United States, conceals and does not as soon as possible make known the same to some judge or other person in civil or military authority under the United States, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than three years, or both.
